- Providence Alaska Medical Center**
 - Psychiatric Emergency Room and 7-bed locked unit
 - Crisis Recovery Center w/ 8 adult beds & 8 juvenile beds
 - 12 voluntary beds
- Alaska Psychiatric Institute**
 - 70 civil commitment beds / 10 forensic beds (TAKU)
- Alaska Native Medical Center**
 - For Alaska Natives and those diverted from other nearby hospitals
- Fairbanks Memorial Hospital (Fairbanks, AK)**
 - 16 beds / 4 ICU
- Bartlett Regional Hospital (Juneau, AK)**
 - 12 beds
- Alaska VA Health Care System**
 - Outpatient only
 - Veteran Justice Outreach
- Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson Hospital**
 - Military

- Covenant House** - Shelter for individuals 24 and under
- Abused Women's Aid in Crisis** - Shelter for women

Dispatch/911

- 25 dispatchers have received CIT training

Emergency Medical Services

Law Enforcement

- Anchorage Police Department**
 - 420 officers
 - 150 officers have received CIT training
 - Community Action Policing Unit (focuses primarily on preventing substance use)
- Mobile Intervention Team**
 - Partnership with Anchorage Fire Department
 - Primary focus is homeless outreach

Arraignment

- Timing**
 - Within 24 hours of arrest
 - Screening for veterans
- Pretrial Risk Assessment**
 - Administered by AK DOC Pretrial Enforcement Division
 - Includes failure to appear and criminal risk

Competency

- Incompetent to Stand Trial cases received daily
- Referred to Alaska Psychiatric Institute for competency restoration

Courts

Treatment Courts

- Mental Health Court (aka Coordinated Resources Project)**
 - 75 capacity
 - 9 month program
 - Misdemeanor and felony cases
 - Some diagnostic exclusion criteria
- Veterans Court**
 - 25 capacity
 - 8-9 month program
 - Open referrals
 - Must be eligible for VA benefits and services
 - LSI-R screening
- Addictions Court(s)**
 - 90 capacity
 - 18-month program with three phases and comprehensive treatment plans
 - Post-plea and probation violations
 - LSI-R screening
- District Court**
 - Centralized Competency Calendar
 - Refers to Mental Health Court

Anchorage Correctional Complex

Jail Population

Approximately 800, mostly males, roughly one third are Alaska Natives

- Screening and Assessment**
 - Brief Jail Mental Health Screen
 - SSI-SA (Substance Use)
 - LSI-R (30 days post-sentencing)
- Training**
 - General MH training including MH First Aid
 - Substance use
 - Trauma-informed care
 - Suicide Prevention

Resources

- East** - 4 FT MH Staff and Anchorage Community MH staff member, screening, medical detox and post-detox units
- West** - 28 bed acute men's unit with 3 mental health clinicians and a 56-bed sub-acute unit with 2 mental health clinicians and mentors. Both units have psychiatric nursing staff.
- Highland** - 18-bed inpatient unit and a 40-bed unit, outpatient substance use treatment and co-occurring disorder treatment, primarily females

Jail Reentry

- Jail In-reach**
 - Funding available for community providers to do in-reach
 - Some Alaska Native in-reach
 - Coalition Coordinators
- Release Planning**
 - Within 30 days of release: Treatment plan, LSI-R scores, and housing
 - Individuals with serious mental illness receive additional assistance (APIC) including transportation, clothing, benefits, and follow-up appointments
 - Many individuals with misdemeanors released directly from court without plans
 - ACMH employee assists with release planning
- Medication**
 - 7 day supply of medication provided at time of release and prescription (if needed)
 - For substance use, Vivitrol offered 3 days prior to release, Narcan provided at time of release, and OTP bridging (within 30 days)
- Alaska Department of Health and Social Services SB91 funding for community-based reentry services**
 - Case management
 - Reentry center
 - 40 individuals on caseload, primarily individuals with felonies, serious mental illness, and medium to high risk levels
- Institutional Discharge Program Plus**
 - 3 clinicians and 2 probation officers
 - Wraparound services for individuals with mental illness on felony probation
- Discharge Incentive Grant for Housing**
- Prison Reentry**
 - Integrated with AK DOC

Probation

- Training**
 - CIT Training (not all)
 - Mental Health First Aid (MHFA)
- Specialized Caseloads**
 - MH Unit has 3 FT officers and approximately 130 individuals on the caseload
 - Serious Mental Illness Unit has approximately 80 individuals on the caseload
 - Other caseloads include sex offenders, Probation Accountability and Certain Enforcement (PACE), Interstate, Wellness, and Veterans Court
- Partners Reentry Center**
 - Peer support groups (people with lived experience in criminal justice system)
- Community Residential Centers**
 - Newly opened for individuals with serious mental illness
 - Similar to work release
 - Underutilized
