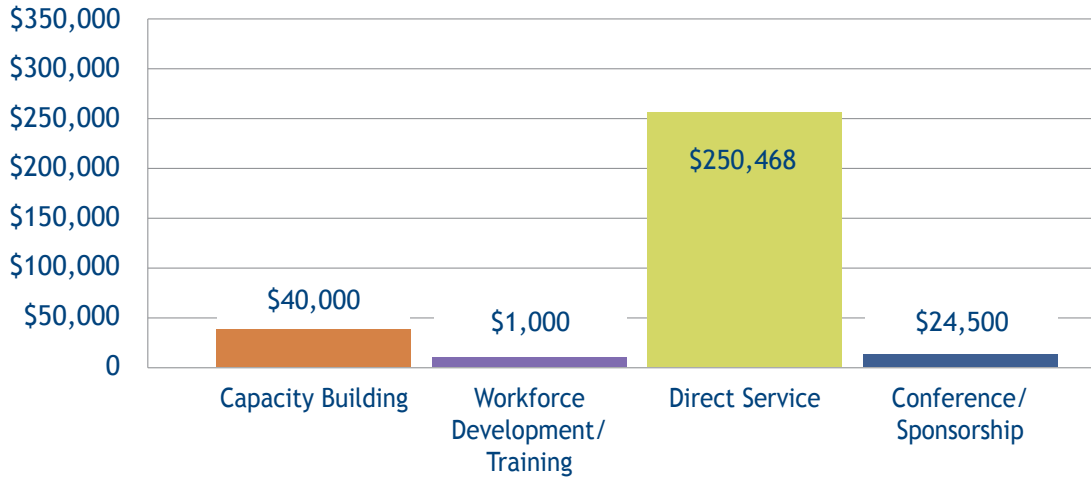
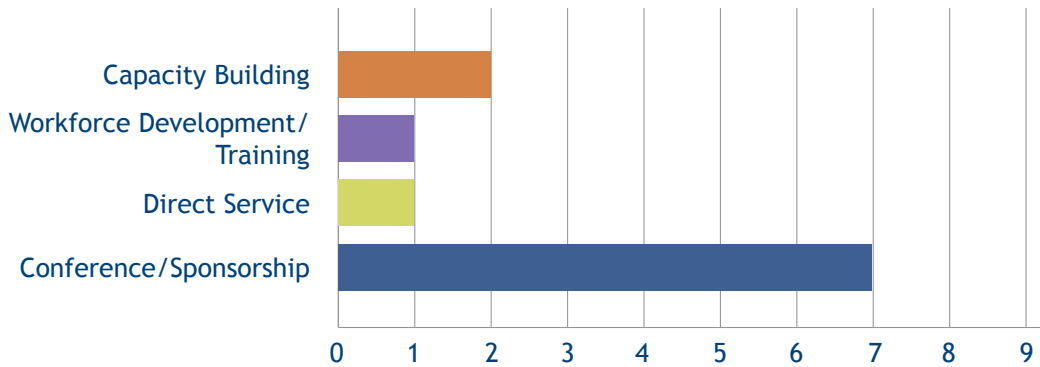

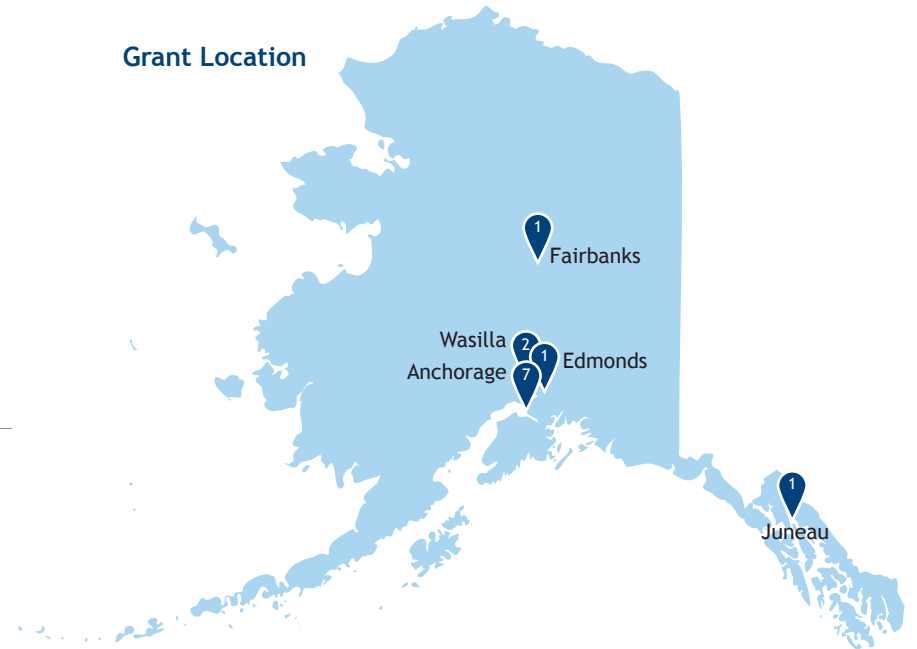
Total Grant Amount by Category

Cook Inlet Tribal Council (CITC) and Katalyst Alaska are hosting emerging leaders training offered by JustleadershipUSA (JLUSA). JLUSA believes that America’s most challenging barrier to expansive, systemic criminal and juvenile justice reform is the absence of clear and consistent leadership by those who have been directly affected by failed criminal justice policies. Emerging leaders training is being offered for individuals in Alaska who have recently reentered society from incarceration and who are organizational and/or community leaders. There are currently sixty individuals registered for the training many of whom are beneficiaries with lived experience and are working with Trust funded reentry coalitions. This training will improve the leadership skills of these individuals and improve their effectiveness as they serve Trust beneficiaries who are involved in the criminal justice system.
