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Therapeutic Court Mission Statement:

The mission of the therapeutic courts is to divert people with substance abuse and/or mental health diagnoses with open court cases (both criminal and civil) into community treatment and services to prevent further contact with the legal system.



The Therapeutic Court Approach



A non-adversarial approach in which together, the Therapeutic Court Team:


- Ensures public safety
- Protects due process rights
- Systematically addresses defendant's substance abuse, mental health, family, and criminality issues



Therapeutic Courts Program Requirements

- Participation in substance use treatment and/or mental health treatment/services
- Frequent court hearings to check-in with the Therapeutic Court Judge/Team
- Compliance with Criminal Rule 11 Plea agreement
- Compliance with individual case and treatment plans
- Frequent, random and fully observed alcohol/drug testing
- If indicated, use of an adjunctive medication to assist with substance withdrawals/cravings
- Attendance at recovery meetings and alumni-facilitated process groups
- If indicated, participation in complementary services such as anger management, mental health, grief/loss, parenting, etc.
- Maintain employment or benefits, and safe/sober housing
- If indicated, completion of GED/vocational referrals
- DUI/Drug Courts- Completion of Phase 5 Restorative Justice Project




Therapeutic Courts– Addiction Courts



- Nexus of the crime is substance use
- By statute, DUI offenders must complete an 18-month program
- Treatment, community supervision, and drug/alcohol testing
- Depending on offense, possibility of sentence reduction or charge dismissal










Coordinated Resources Projects – Mental Health Courts


- Beneficiary of the Alaska Mental Health Trust:
 - Mental Illness
 - Chronic Alcohol or Drug Addiction
 - Traumatic Brain Injury
 - Developmental Disability, Including FASD
 - Alzheimer's & Dementia
- Individualized case plan that addresses treatment and public safety
- Depending on offense, possibility of sentence reduction or charge dismissal











Misc. offenses include: MICS, failure to stop, false report, promote contraband, resisting a Peace Officer, unlawful contact, trespass, indecent exposure




Therapeutic Courts – Veterans Court

- Anchorage court established in 2004; Fairbanks court established in 2022
- These courts honor Veterans and their service to the country
- Connects Veteran offenders to services provided by the Veterans Administration for mental health and substance abuse issues, housing, and employment






Anchorage & Fairbanks Veterans Courts Types of Admitting Offenses - 2024 n = 17 Participants









Estimated Jail Time Saved by FY24 Graduates



Anchorage Felony DUI/Drug Court – 54 Years
Fairbanks Wellness Court – 22 Years
Palmer Wellness Court – 36 Years
Juneau Therapeutic Court – 6 Years

Estimated total saved = 118 Years @ \$202 Cost/day

- BJA Training Grant- DUI/Drug Court Evaluation (End of March 2025)
