Rural Health Transformation Program Basics



The RHTP is a five-year, \$50 billion federal initiative to transform rural health care delivery and improve access and health outcomes.



Half of the funds will be distributed across states based on rural health needs, the other half will be split evenly.



Alaska's rural nature positions us well to receive a substantial federal investment in annual allotments.

RHTP Funding Timeline

- Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2026–2030: States will receive annual awards. States have one year to incur costs (obligate funds) and an additional year to finish spending them.
- Begin March 31, 2028, CMS will start annually redistributing unspent funds. Any final reallocated funds must be spent by the end of FFY 2032.



Healthy Beginnings

Goal: Strengthen maternal and child health as a foundation for healthy families, especially in rural areas.



- Technology-enabled maternal care
- Facility renovations and modernization
- Workforce supports and staffing models
- Home-visiting programs and early intervention
- Youth programming in school-based and community-based settings
- Technical Assistance to support Healthy Beginnings projects



Health Care Access

Goal: Expand and sustain access to essential health services across Alaska's communities, both on and off the road system.

- Primary care
- Behavioral health
- Dental services
- Specialist services
- Complex care homes

Health Care Access

Goal: Expand and sustain access to essential health services across Alaska's communities, both on and off the road system.


Potential Uses of Funds (continued):

- Alternative payment methodologies for hospitals, and prevention and chronic disease management
- Exploration of CMMI's AHEAD model
- Care models for dually-eligible Alaskans
- Planning grants to support value-based payment arrangements and alternative payment models
- Technical Assistance to support Pay for Value projects

Strengthen Workforce

Goal: Build a robust and resilient rural health care workforce.

- "Grow our own" certification programs
- Training and workforce development programs, including reskill and upskill
- Expansion of physician residency programs
- Structured incentives for high-need rural providers
- Expanded scopes of practice for certain providers
- Housing and child care recruitment and retention incentives
- Technical Assistance to support *Strengthen Workforce* projects



Spark Technology & Innovation

Goal: Harness data and technology to enable rural providers to deliver secure, efficient, and high-quality care.

- Consumer-facing digital tools
- Al tools for providers
- Community-based system navigation apps
- Health information exchange projects

- Data analytics across multi-payer systems

Rural Health Transformation Program

The Rural Health Transformation Program (RHTP) is a \$50 billion federal opportunity to improve health care in rural areas across all fifty states.

The Alaska Department of Health (DOH) has submitted an application to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) to bring this funding to Alaska.

- \$50 billion will be allocated to participating states over five years, with half of the funds split evenly across all states and half allocated based on rural health needs
- Alaska is expected to receive a larger share due to its rural geography
- Funds may be used for a wide variety of activities to improve rural health care, including technology modernization, workforce development, innovative care models, and prevention measures for chronic disease and substance use disorder

Alaska's Application and Proposed Initiatives

As part of its application, Alaska proposed six statewide initiatives that reflect ideas and feedback from hundreds of organizations and community partners. These initiatives outline how Alaska could use RHTP funds to improve access to care, strengthen the workforce, support healthier communities, and transform Alaska's health care delivery systems.
