


Grant Approval Process for Authority Grant Funds

All annual budgets are approved by the full board of trustees at the September meeting





Many of the individuals experiencing homelessness are Alaska Mental Health Trust Beneficiaries struggling with the symptoms of traumatic brain injuries and other qualified conditions. Many of the most vulnerable individuals do not stay in shelters and are not connected to services. The street outreach program allows for time and resources to address unsheltered individuals in our community and connect them to resources with the final goal of ending the cycle of hunger and homelessness.

Project Budget Narrative: Please provide a brief 5-7 sentences of how you plan to use the funds requested. (Personnel, equipment, facilities, etc.)

The funds will be used for personnel costs and will allow us to have a person on staff to address individuals outside of our shelter system. Part of the funds will be used for miscellaneous client needs such as bus passes, identification acquisition fees, and other small but essential items which will result in an improvement of the unsheltered homelessness situation. The funds will also be used for vehicle gas, small food items, socks, and other relationship building tokens.

Problem Being Addressed: Unsheltered individuals experiencing homelessness are often most vulnerable. There is not an established connection to resources such as emergency shelters, transitional housing, mental health services, and medical assistance. For the last year, the street outreach project has allowed the community of Juneau resources to reach those experiencing homelessness on the streets and connect these individuals to the continuum of care service programs. We would like to continue the program for one more year to ensure that all those









CEO and Trustee Authorizations




FY23 Approvals from Unallocated Budget Lines (To-Date)





FY23-Number of CEO-Approved Grants per Grantee


Grantees that receive more than one Trust grant in a year are typically engaged in multiple beneficiary-serving programs/activities.





- **Capacity Building:** projects increasing the skills and competencies of the workforce, supporting the expansion of services, and growing/strengthening beneficiary-serving organizations providing direct services.
- Direct Service: projects providing services directly impacting the lives of Trust beneficiaries.
- **Capital-Construction and Capital-Equipment:** projects providing material infrastructure (including brick and mortar investments), and that develop system capacity or support the improvement in the quality of life for Trust beneficiaries.
- **Conference Sponsorship:** support for conferences, seminars and training to organizations that serve Trust beneficiaries for a specific purpose or need that aligns with the Trust's mission and priorities.
- Workforce Development & Training: projects that support strategies to build and train a capable and competent workforce serving Trust beneficiaries.
- **Data and Planning:** projects supporting data collection, research and planning to aid in the development and strategic design of systems improvements impacting beneficiaries.
- **Outreach:** projects providing information and/or services to individuals, agencies and communities, who might otherwise not have access.
