Exploration In 2022

The first phase of resource definition drilling at the Grinder Prospect was conducted during June, July and August of 2022. During the three months of operation TLO had about 24 people in camp, including geologists, drillers, sample processing technicians, camp maintenance personnel, mechanics, and cooks. Besides the field crews, TLO also has leading industry consultants working on the Icy Cape Project.





Further Exploration In 2023

Building on our field work in 2022, in 2023 the TLO will conduct the second phase of resource definition drilling at its Grinder Prospect. The exploration team consists of placer gold and industrial heavy minerals experts. In addition, bulk sampling is planned for metallurgical engineering and industrial processing engineering tests.


In addition to increased tax revenues and local business activity, the community may benefit from job opportunities at the project site as well.

The Trust Land Office

Residing within the Department of Natural Resources, the Trust Land Office (TLO) is contracted exclusively by the Alaska Mental Health Trust Authority to manage its approximately one million acres of land and other non-cash assets to generate revenue. The TLO has a responsibility, by law, to maximize revenue generation from Trust land assets and does so by selling and developing its land and resources. All decisions pertaining to the use of Trust lands must be made in the best financial interest of the Trust and its beneficiaries. In order to support vital services for beneficiaries, the Trust needs to continue to take proactive steps to generate revenue from the land and resources it was granted for that purpose.
