Requested Motion:

The Program and Planning Committee recommends that the Board of Trustees approve a \$300,000 Authority Grant to Christian Health Associates for the Anchorage Project Access Mental Health Counseling Program grant. These funds will come from the Trust Focus Area Strategy Implementation line of the FY26 budget.

Staff Analysis:

- What does this project do?
Trust funds will maintain a Mental Health Counseling Coordinator position for the Anchorage Project Access Pro Bono Counseling Program and support general operations for three years.
- Who is receiving the funds?
Christian Health Associates (CHA) is a non-profit corporation that maintains various associates that operate under the CHA umbrella. Anchorage Project Access (APA) is one of the associated organizations under CHA. APA provides Alaska's health care safety net for Trust beneficiaries, which ensures access to donated specialty medical, dental, and mental health services. Since 2016, APA has been connecting people in Anchorage who need care with healthcare professionals interested in donating care.
- Why is staff recommending this project?
Using APA as a clearinghouse for donated behavioral health care will make it easier for mental health practitioners to offer pro bono services and for beneficiaries to obtain them. This project will primarily serve low-income, uninsured beneficiaries who have a mental health condition, though all beneficiary categories may be served through the project. This project aligns with the Mental Health and Addiction Intervention Focus Area, improving beneficiary access to care. Beneficiaries will also be screened and referred to health insurance programs so they can obtain long term access to care.
- Will this be a multi-year project?
This project is proposed as a three-year project for partner funding. Over the past two years, the project has successfully started up and continued investment is needed through this implementation stage so the project can sustain and scale like the agency's other programs that provide donated health care and dental care services. Since 2023,

45 providers are enrolled to donate mental health treatment through APA, 63 referrals have been made resulting in 127 appointments for services.

Project Description (from grant application)

APA has been providing Trust beneficiaries who experience mental illness and substance use disorders who are uninsured, and have limited income, with donated specialty health care for 20 years through the generosity of over 825 volunteer health care partners. APA added donated dental services in 2016 and mental health counseling (MHC) in 2023. APA is the only project access in the country offering these three services. As services for Trust beneficiaries become more limited due to reductions in federal funding for Medicaid and ACA health insurance, APA's MHC services will be essential to the well-being of Alaskans with mental illness, mental health concerns, and/or substance abuse conditions.

Trust beneficiaries continue to be underserved as health care systems struggle to meet the needs of individuals with mental health issues. Mental health programs in Alaska often have extensive waiting lists. Individuals with mental health concerns often have complex and untreated health care needs. There is a lack of cohesive services for individuals with mental illness, adverse childhood experiences, poverty, homelessness, untreated substance misuse, violence, trauma, and involvement with the criminal justice system. These factors contribute to Trust beneficiaries needing multiple types of

support to improve health outcomes. APA's MHC services have expanded the ability across Alaska to meet the needs of Trust beneficiaries who have limited access to comprehensive, trauma informed care. APA's counseling services are offered in Anchorage, Fairbanks, and via telehealth, to all eligible Alaskans. Individuals who may be working, but without financial resources to access mental health counseling, are more effectively served through APA's MHC program to address anxiety disorders, depression, grief issues, substance misuse, divorce, parenting, etc. In addition, Trust beneficiaries who have unmet medical and/or dental health needs may access a full array of donated specialty health care services once they are enrolled into APA's program.

APA's trauma informed staff will directly assist beneficiaries to access donated mental health, medical, and/or dental care, and enroll in health insurance. APA staff assist patients to maximize their utilization of health insurance and navigate complex systems of care. All participants will be connected to a primary care health home.

After initiating mental health counseling services in 2023, the MHC program has become an integral part of APA's donated care services. The program encompasses a thorough review of patients' self-reported medical history in order to note mental health concerns. As part of the intake and assessment process, the mental health counseling program coordinator will cross-reference each patient's self-reported medical history with their electronic health records (EHR) to ensure accuracy and completeness. This comparison helps identify any discrepancies or omissions, allowing the coordinator to confirm that all relevant mental health concerns, diagnoses, and treatment histories are properly documented. By integrating both sources of information, the coordinator ensures a more comprehensive understanding of the patient's overall health, which supports more informed clinical decisions and effective care planning. In addition, the MHC coordinator will process referrals and coordinate care for medical patients referred for neurological care and sleep studies. Patients referred for these services often experience extensive anxiety and depression due to untreated medical conditions.

APA's no cost counseling program has recruited over 17 therapists who have the capacity to donate to approximately 40 patients at any given time. APA produced and aired an MHC PSA on television and radio to promote the program. APA conducted over 20 outreach sessions in 2025 to promote the MHC services. APA receives self-referrals for counseling from individuals submitting the online form via APA's website, and from other health care partners. APA recruits providers, screens and enrolls clients, and coordinates their care. APA's MHC coordinator will network with behavioral health associations, clinics, individual clinicians, health fairs, and educational institutions to provide a minimum of 20 outreach sessions per year to educate the community on mental health and APA's services. In 2025 APA processed 46 referrals for counseling. In collaboration with APA's MHC patients, donating therapists determine the length of treatment to address the needs of the patient. APA enrolls patients for six-month periods. MHC patients can be reenrolled for as many six-month increments as needed.

APA's pro bono counseling services are available to people of all ages. Concerns range from depression, anxiety, abuse, self-esteem, relationships, divorce, grief, trauma, substance misuse, and life transitions. APA's MHC coordinator conducts an initial mental health screening of the person's concerns. When enrolled, the client is matched with a donating therapist. In the first two years of the program, APA coordinated neuropsych testing and individual counseling from licensed clinicians, and supervised graduate students, providing telehealth and in person sessions. APA convenes a MHC Committee with local experts to support the program.

Sustainability (from grant application)

APA has diversified funding sources over the past 20 years to sustain our three primary program components: specialty medical, dental, and mental health counseling, services. In addition to primary funding from the State of Alaska, the Providence Foundation, HRSA, Rasmuson Foundation, and the Trust, APA receives significant funding from private foundations and corporate grants. Private foundations have increased their support over the past few years. APA also conducts an annual health related fundraiser “Revolutions-Spinning for Health Care.” In 2025, the 15th year of the event, the fundraiser generated \$95,000 in revenue. The mental health counseling program is such a critical part of APA’s core programs that the financial sustainability of the program is essential.

Who We Serve (from grant application)

APA ensures Trust beneficiaries with mental illness, mental health concerns, and substance misuse, achieve the goals and objectives of Alaska's Comprehensive Integrated Mental Health Program plan FY 2025 – FY 2029 through APA's no cost mental health counseling program. Through APA's effective and efficient collaboration with donating mental health clinicians, UAA's Counseling Center, Cornerstone Counseling, and other clinics in Alaska, the program provides comprehensive, holistic care, to those most in need. In partnership with over 825 donating specialty physicians, dentists, therapists, and ancillary care providers, APA restores physical health, mental health, and the ability for Trust beneficiaries to live with dignity, hope, and the ability to work. APA enrolled patients are eligible to receive donated medical, dental, and mental health counseling services.

APA assists Trust beneficiaries to achieve the following goals and objectives of the Alaska Comprehensive Integrated Mental Health Program plan FY 2025 - FY 2029:

1. Early Childhood and Youth, Objectives: 1.4 & 1.5. | APA serves individuals of all ages

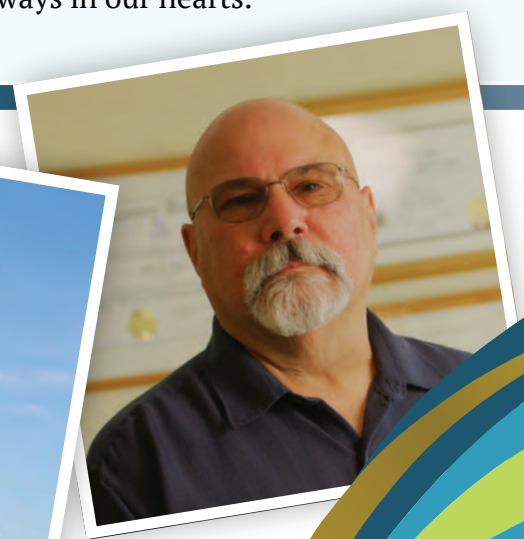

25 years ago, driven by a spirit of beneficence, a group of Alaskans recognized an unmet need in our community and committed their time and expertise to addressing it. The Anchorage Access to Health Care Coalition, made up of innovative and compassionate physicians, business experts, philanthropists, and faith leaders, came together to create a pathway to restore health for individuals and families without access to specialty care or health insurance. Understanding that these barriers negatively impact work and family life, our founders selected a donated care model called Project Access. Christian Health Associates was designated to operate the non-profit program. Today, as we celebrate 20 years of serving our most vulnerable neighbors and friends, we honor our founders for their vision and commitment to improving the lives of Alaskans by creating Anchorage Project Access, the only health care safety net of its kind in Alaska.

From our humble beginnings, starting with 250 donating medical specialists, we have grown to a network of over 800 medical, dental, and mental health providers in 2025, comprised of more than 60 healthcare specialties. Their generosity has provided care to more than 9,500 enrolled and reenrolled patients. Recognizing the need for whole-person care, we expanded our services to include dental care in 2016 and mental health counseling in 2023. We are inspired every day by the selflessness and dedication of our donating providers and supporters.

As stated by Dr. KC Kaltenborn, founding member and donating endocrinologist, “Anchorage Project Access allows physicians a simple way to go back to the kind of medicine that we were trained to deliver when we were medical students and residents. JOSHUA KIELE

A Journey Back to Health

In 2000, Joshua Kiele's life was changed forever when he was struck by a train, leaving him with two broken arms and chronic pain that made even walking difficult. At just 30 years old, he needed a hip replacement, but without health insurance and unable to work consistently due to the pain, the cost of surgery was out of reach. "I got behind on a lot of bills. Just the basics were hard to come by," Joshua shared. In 2005, he moved to Alaska to be near his brother, hoping for support for himself and his children.

After being diagnosed with Congenital Hip Dysplasia by Dr. Stephen Tower at Anchorage Fracture and Orthopedic Clinic, Joshua was referred to Anchorage Project Access (APA), a new program at the time dedicated to helping people like him access life-changing care.

Joshua became one of APA's first patients, and in February 2006, Dr. Tower successfully performed a total right hip replacement, at no cost to Joshua. Reflecting on his experience, Joshua said, "Thanks to APA, Dr. Tower, Providence Hospital, and all those who helped me, I'm living a healthier, more confident, and happy life."

YVETTE CONIDES

A Smile Restored

"I have always worked hard but health insurance was never affordable through the jobs I had. After I was divorced, I found myself in some difficult situations with substance abuse and co-dependent relationships. One of those abusive relationships landed me in the hospital; another caused me to lose my teeth. I did not have any health insurance and I continued to struggle with addiction and abusive relationships. My health situation was poor. It was very embarrassing to not have any teeth and I had horrible self-esteem.

The Anchorage Neighborhood Health Center (ANHC) helped me with my knee and ankle problems and connected me to Anchorage Project Access (APA).

Thanks to APA I have my smile back and am more confident than ever! APA also helped me with donated orthopedic care for my knee problems and helped me obtain health insurance.

I am clean and sober now. My family relationships are mended and renewed. I have self-worth now that I didn't have before. I have my own place and a good job.

APA gives people hope where they may not have had any. The people who provide these services are such a blessing to people who have no insurance and need medical attention. Sometimes it takes a lot of humility to admit that one needs help. It has been a humbling, life-changing experience for me and I am truly grateful to the contributors and the staff at APA. Thank you from the bottom of my heart!"

From Crisis to Care

In September 2012, David was rushed to the hospital with severe abdominal pain. A CT scan revealed a life-threatening abdominal aneurysm. Without health insurance, David used more than half of his life savings to cover the emergency department charges. "I've always been a pay-as-you-go person, but this was more than I could handle," he recalled.

The prognosis was grim: without surgery, the aneurysm could rupture and be fatal. The emergency department staff handed him a card for Anchorage Project Access (APA). Skeptical but desperate, David called. "To my shock, they said they could help me. It was a sit-down-before-you-fall-down moment."

APA connected David with Dr. Marbarger at Alaska Heart & Vascular Institute. He was quickly scheduled for surgery and even donated his own blood. The surgery was a success, and the care David received left a lasting impact. "The level of care I received was incredible. The staff was professional and compassionate—it was unlike anything I had ever experienced," David said. "They saved my life. I now have the chance to give back. Project Access proves that every life matters."



Restoring health & hope to Alaskans in need

A look back at 20 years of service

The Anchorage Access to Health Care Coalition was formed with the mission of improving access to health care for medically underserved community members in Anchorage.

The "Volunteer Health Care Provider Immunity Act" was passed by the Alaska legislature.

APA added a pharmacy component to client services in partnership with Carrs/Safeway and Anchorage Neighborhood Health Center (ANHC).

APA served its first 1,000 patients.
The Mt. Huntington Award was introduced to recognize APA providers for their generosity and commitment.

APA held its first annual fundraising event, *Revolutions: Spinning for Health Care*, and raised over \$58,000.

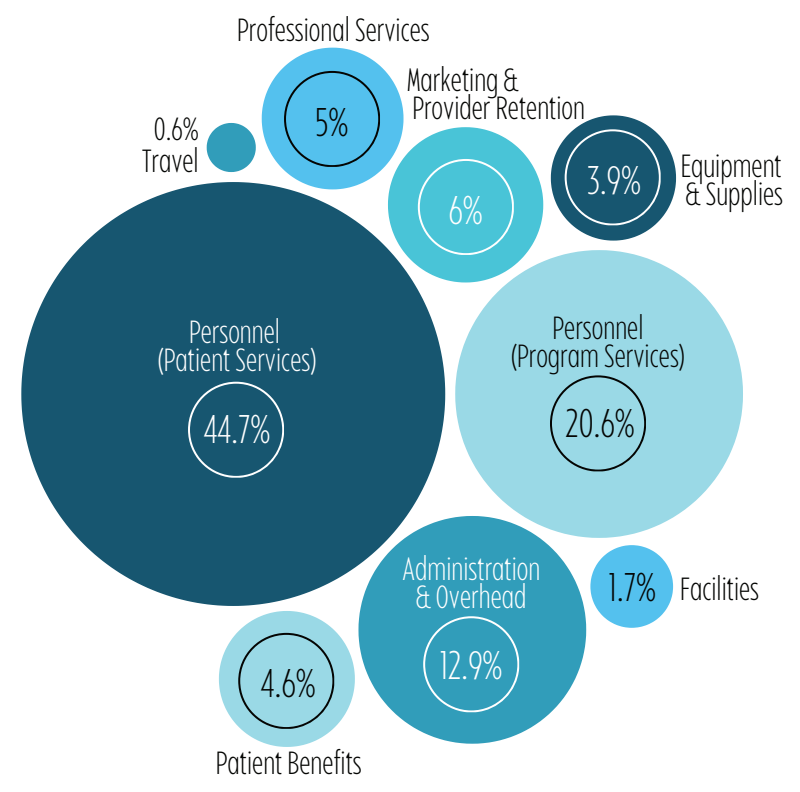
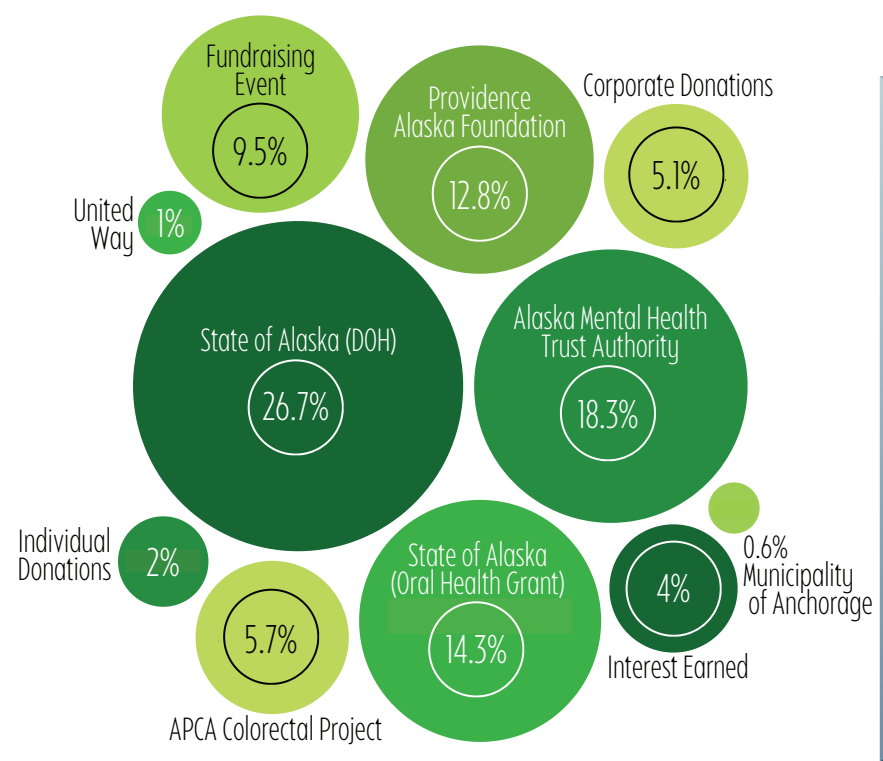
